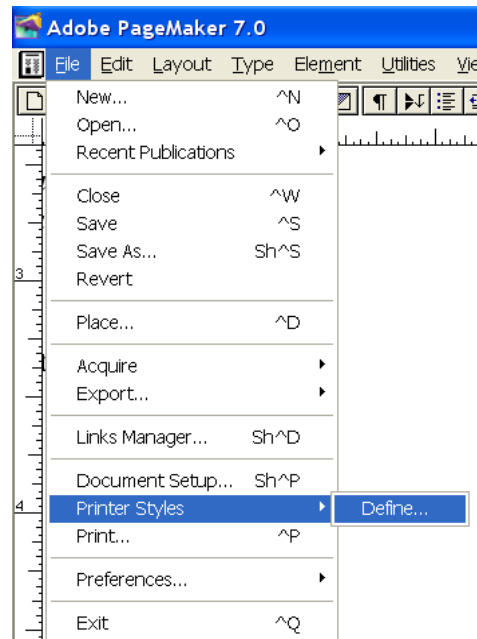

**Adobe PageMaker 7.0 - PC**

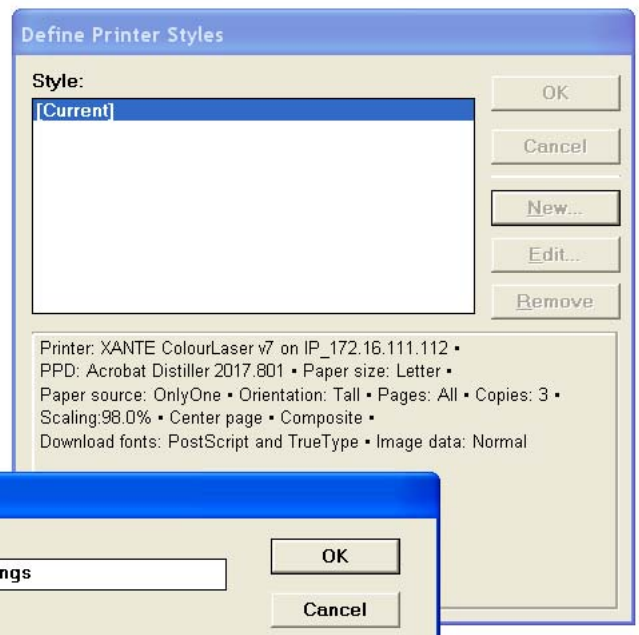
**Creating A Printer Style For Saving PostScript:** *Note: By saving **Printer Styles**, you won't have to re-configure the settings every time you save your PostScript files.*

\*\*\* This instruction package was created on Windows XP. Items may appear differently depending on what operating system you are running on your machine.

- From the **File** menu, select **Printer Styles > Define**.

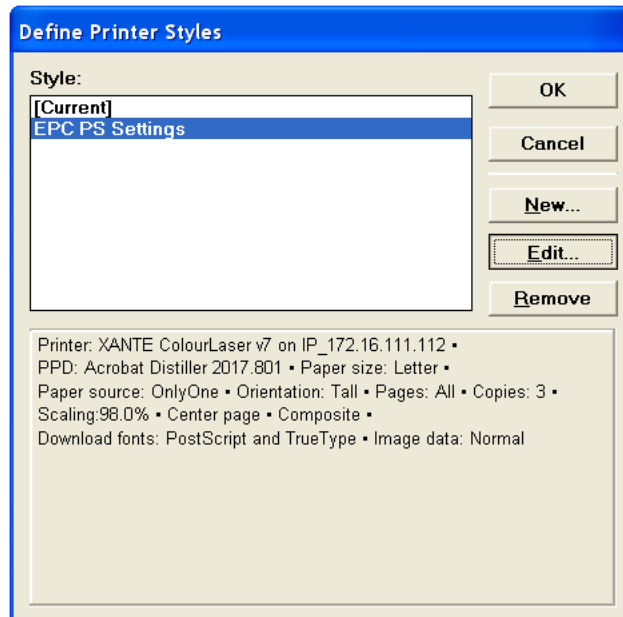


- In the **Define Printer Styles** dialog box, click **New...**



...and name the **Print Style**. Click **OK**.

- Click **Edit...**



On right-hand side of dialog box select...

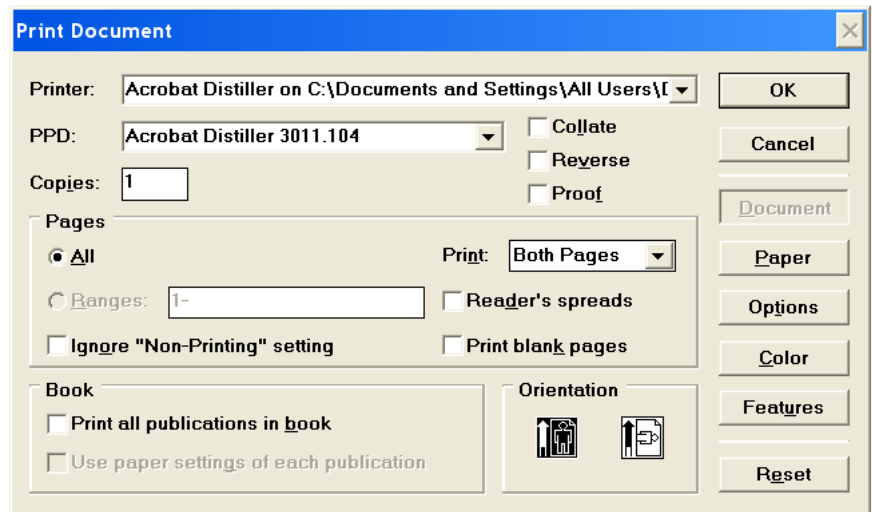
**Document:** Match example to the right.

- Beside Printer..., choose **Acrobat Distiller**.

- Beside PPD:, select **“Acrobat Distiller 3010.106”** (Adist4.ppd) which shipped with Acrobat Distiller 4.0 or **“Acrobat Distiller 3011.104”** (Adist5.ppd.) which shipped with Acrobat Distiller 5.0.

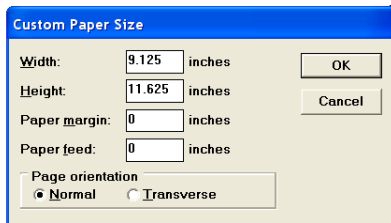
***It is very important that this PPD is chosen and NOT “Acrobat Distiller 2017.801” (ADISTILL.ppd) which shipped with Acrobat Distiller 3.0. (“Acrobat Distiller 2017.801” assigns RGB Color Space which will result in color separations other than what you expected.)***

- Under Pages, select the page range that you wish to save.

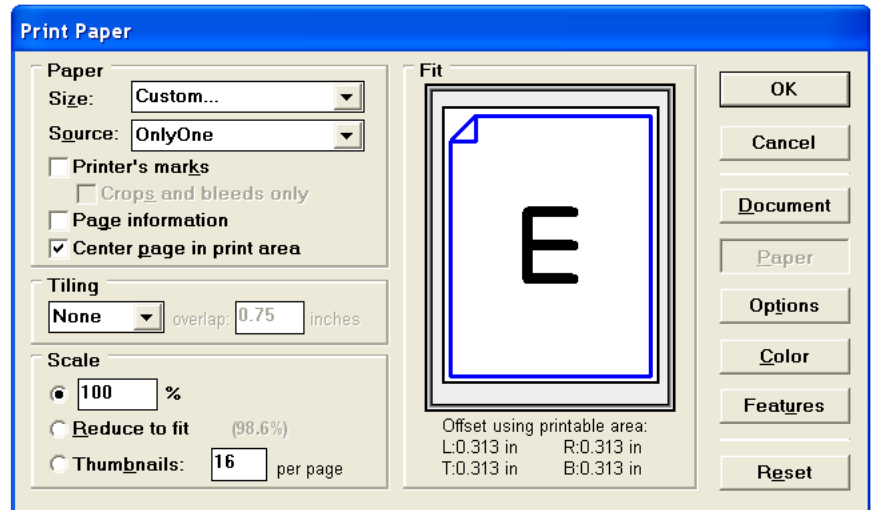


**Paper:** Match example to the right.

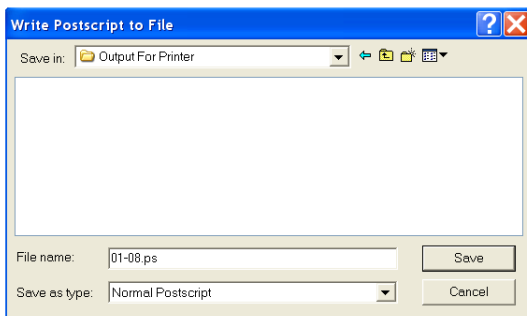
- Select Custom for the paper size.



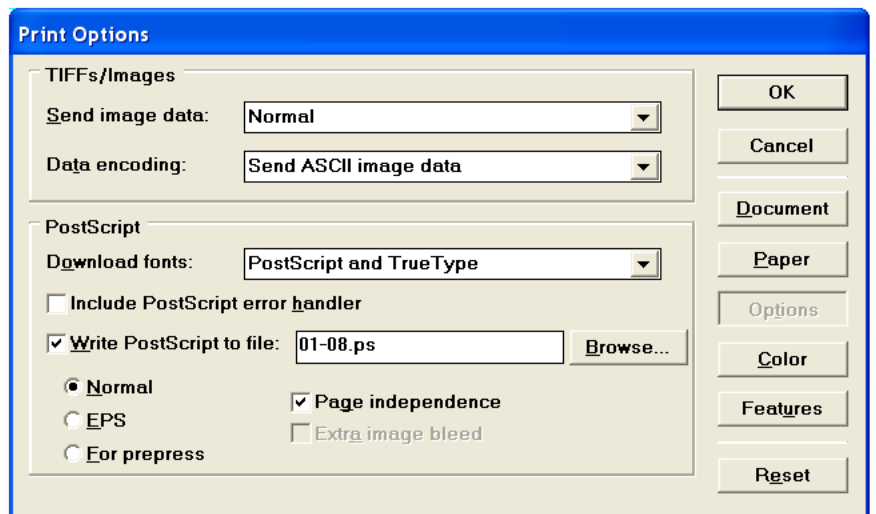
Enter a width 1" larger than your document setup.



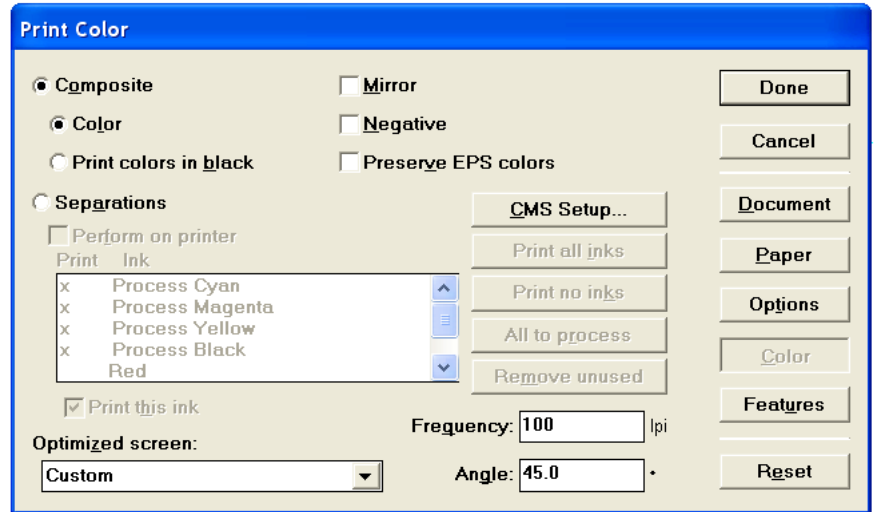
**Options:** Match example to the right.



When actually saving the .ps files, click Save as...  
...name the PostScript file by the page range and description of job.  
(Example: 01-08 EPC.ps)



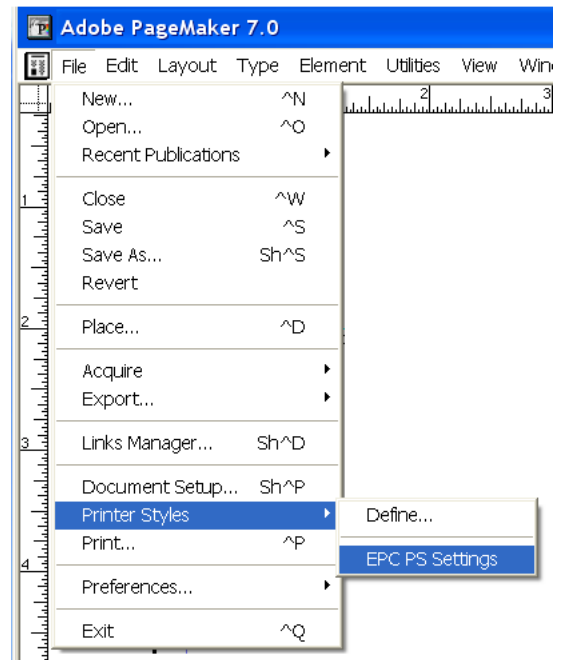
**Color:** Match example to the right.



- Click **OK...** (There are no options to select in the **Features** area.)

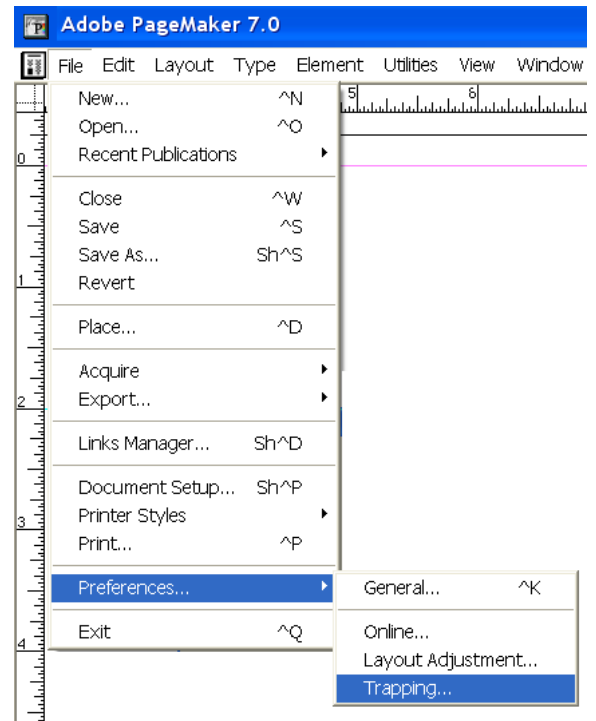
- A **Printer Style** has been saved.

- To print a Postscript file, go into **File > Printer Styles...** and select the **Printer Style** saved with above settings.



*Tip: Before saving your PostScript files, make sure that document trapping is not enabled. When saving a PostScript file in PageMaker with trapping on, PageMaker elements may be assigned strokes that do not appear correctly.*

- This is located under **File > Preferences > Trapping...**



- Match example to the right.
